Stewart has also led on programmes focusing on community cohesion and safer neighbourhoods, as well as being seconded as Head of Secretariat at the London Bombings Relief Fund in 2005, the UK's first national disaster fund, established in the wake of 7/7 to distribute £12m received in public donations to the injured survivors and bereaved families. Stewart will support the Cause4 team in developing a number of new philanthropic Foundations.
