In 2013 Cause4 was awarded a fast-growth Award from Unltd and was also recognised in the Silicon Valley UK 100 list for the top 100 UK companies showing potential to generate multi-million pound revenues.

Cause4 is an entrepreneur incubator, providing training and support to help people succeed in important charitable projects, innovative businesses and social enterprises, and to raise vital funds. Since May 2009, Cause4 has raised over £36 million for clients, regularly raising over £500,000 in charitable income per month.
